The Refuge was made possible by the Eleanor Coster family, the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation, the Iowa Dept. of Natural Resources, and most importantly by hundreds of donors and volunteers.

The Refuge is a favorite roosting place for the bald eagles and is an integral part of the annual Bald Eagle Days event.
