Public Hearings: Open - Chairman Nichols

1.) Marion County Board of Supervisors - The Marion County Board of Supervisors are considering the disposition of one (1) County owned waterline to the Marion County Rural Water District and one (1) County owned waterline to the City of Knoxville, for one dollar and other valuable consideration.

4 inch Marion County Residential Care Facility Waterline – In 1977 the Marion County Board of Supervisors deemed it necessary to replace approximately 4,000' of 2 inch water line with 4 inch waterline to the Marion County Residential Care Facility. The County waterline began at the end of the City of Knoxville waterline and runs along 110th Avenue. Several landowners in the area access the waterline. In 1998 the Marion County Board of Supervisors deemed it necessary to discontinue using the 4 inch waterline and assisted the Marion County Rural Water District in the construction of a new waterline to service the Marion County Residential Care Facility. This waterline begins near Highway 14 and runs in a westerly direction across the Knoxville Municipal Airport ground and continues west along Newbold Street to the Care Facility. The Marion County Board of Supervisors now desires to dispose of their entire interest and turn the 4 inch waterline, running from the end of the City of Knoxville line to the Marion County Residential Care Facility, to the Marion County Rural Water District. The current users of the waterline will continue to access the waterline, but will be required to convert to meters used by the Marion County Rural Water District.

8 inch DHS Waterline – In 1992 the Marion County Board of Supervisors deemed it necessary to construct approximately 2000' of new 8 inch waterline to supply water to the Department of Human Services building owned by Marion County. The line began at the end of the Ben Bontrager (now MidAmerican) property and runs along Hwy T-15 to the DHS building. Several landowners in the area access the waterline. The Marion County Board of Supervisors now desires to dispose of their entire interest of the 8 inch waterline and turn it over to the City of Knoxville. The landowners accessing the waterline will continue to right of access.

Nichols gave an overview of the proposed dispositions. There were no comments received from the public. Pothoven moved and Mater seconded to close the public hearing.

Resolutions:

1.) Pothoven moved and Mater seconded to approve Resolution 07/53 to ratify CIETC Settlement Agreement.

Whereas, Marion County is a governmental agency and as part of the exercise of its lawful authority, voluntarily entered into a 28E Agreement that created and established the Central Iowa Employment and Training Consortium (CIETC) as a separate and independent unit of limited purpose government;

Whereas, the 28E Agreement made no provision for assessments to the respective CIETC member governments, but recognized the potential for shared, voluntary contributions based on a pre-determined formula;

Whereas, the CIETC governing Board, made up of representatives duly appointed by the CIETC member governments, entered into an engagement agreement with the firm of Davis, Brown, Koehn, Shors, & Roberts, P.C. (Davis Brown) for legal services to be rendered on an hourly basis at discounted hourly rates;

Whereas, the State of Iowa, unsupported by Iowa law, has nonetheless asserted the liability of individual member governments for the obligations of the CIETC entity;

Whereas, the advice, counsel, and services of Davis Brown have directly benefited CIETC and have inured to the benefit of the CIETC member governments;

Whereas, the resources of CIETC could not lawfully be used for legal services necessary to resolve Intergovernmental Disputes;

Whereas, Davis Brown has provided valuable services in the assertion of claims and defenses arising out of a variety of matters, including the Intergovernmental Dispute with the State of Iowa, Iowa Workforce Development arising out of the federal government's demand for repayment from the State of Iowa of the compromise sum of \$1,300,000.00 for alleged disallowed costs;

Whereas, a settlement of the Intergovernmental Dispute with the State of Iowa, Iowa Workforce Development has been achieved between CIETC, its member governments, and the State of Iowa, Iowa Workforce Development, as memorialized in a Settlement Agreement and Release that is subject to ratification by CIETC and each of its member governments;

Whereas, a continuation of the services of Davis Brown is contemplated and deemed necessary and appropriate in order to effectuate the settlement; and

Whereas, in order to ratify the Settlement Agreement and Release to resolve the CIETC Intergovernmental Dispute with the State of Iowa, Iowa Workforce Development:

It Is Therefore Resolved by the Marion County Board of Supervisors that the County hereby ratifies the settlement agreement entered into between CIETC, the member governments, and the State of Iowa, Iowa Workforce Development, subject to ratification by all other CIETC member governments.

It Is Therefore Further Resolved by the Marion County Board of Supervisors that the County hereby voluntarily agrees to the payment of \$3,373.99 as its proportionate share of attorney fees and cash advances incurred through October 31, 2007, and thereafter pursuant to the aforesaid engagement and in accordance with the formula set forth in the CIETC 28E Agreement.

It Is Further Resolved by the Marion County Board of Supervisors that the County is authorized to execute such documents and do such things as necessary to effectuate resolutions of the CIETC Intergovernmental Dispute.

2.) Mater moved and Pothoven seconded to approve Resolution 07/54 to approve CIETC Settlement, Agreement, Release, and Assignment regarding Iowa Community Assurance Pool (ICAP) and Employers Mutual Casualty Company (EMC).

Whereas a settlement has been reached in the Intergovernmental Dispute portion of the CIETC matter, and;

Whereas ICAP has entered into an agreement with Marion County to pay certain legal and other expenses connected with the Intergovernmental Dispute, and;

Whereas as a part of the settlement agreement, an agreement with ICAP involving payment of funds, release, and assignment of claims is necessary,

Whereas EMC has agreed to participate in the settlement and requires release from the other Member Governments to do so,

It Is Therefore Resolved by the Marion County Board of Supervisors that the ICAP Settlement Agreement, Release, and Assignment and the Settlement Agreement and Release with EMC are ratified, subject to ratification by all other CIETC Member Governments.

1.) Mater moved and Pothoven seconded to approve Resolution 07/55 to take action on a "Construction Evaluation Resolution" using the Master matrix regarding confined animal feeding operations effective 02/01/08 – 01/31/09 as follows:

Whereas, Iowa Code section 459.304(3) sets out the procedure if a board of supervisors wishes to adopt a "construction evaluation resolution" relating to the construction of a confinement feeding operation structure; and

Whereas, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution can submit to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) an adopted recommendation to approve or disapprove a construction permit application regarding a proposed confinement feeding operation structure; and

Whereas, only counties that have adopted a construction evaluation resolution and submitted an adopted recommendation may contest the DNR's decision regarding a specific application; and

Whereas, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2008 and January 31, 2009 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

Whereas, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Board Of Supervisors Of Marion County that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

2.) Pothoven moved and Mater seconded to approve Resolution 07/56 to designate authorized signers of Work Beyond Right-of-Way Agreements for the Secondary Road Department as follows:

Whereas, In the performance of its maintenance duties the Secondary Road Department is at times required to work beyond the right-of-way and to enter on to private property, and

Whereas, such entry requires a signed agreement between the affected property owner and Marion County to allow entry on to private property, and

Whereas, such agreements currently are reviewed and signed at regularly scheduled board meetings which at times causes up to a two week delay in starting the work and whereas it would be to the departments advantage if the

Chairman of the Board and the County Engineer could sign the agreements following execution by the property owner to avoid time delays.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Marion County Iowa that the Chairman of the Board and the County Engineer be hereby authorized and empowered on behalf of the Board of Supervisors of Marion County to execute any and all Work Beyond Right-of-Way Agreements that do not involve monetary compensation. All agreements involving monetary compensation shall be acted upon and signed by the entire board.
